

Autumn targets for Reading and Writing – Year 1




- To write a simple sentence that is punctuated with a capital letter and full stop.
- To leave clear finger space between words.
- To correct form lower-case letters in the correct direction, starting and finishing in the right place.




- Read aloud their home/school reading book regularly. (5 times a week).
- To use their phonic knowledge to decode unknown words.
- To recall the main points of a text in the correct sequence.

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
To develop fluency in numbers, addition




To count, read and write numbers to 100 in numerals.



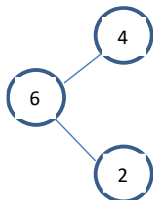
It is important that children develop secure understanding of the value of each digit. The language used to name numbers does not always expose the place value, for example the word twelve does not make it transparent that the value of this number is ten and two.



To represent and use number bonds and related subtraction facts within 20.



Remember an addition number sentence can be inverted to make a subtraction number sentence.



$4 + 2 = 6$
$2 + 4 = 6$
$6 - 4 = 2$
$6 - 2 = 4$
