

Summer targets for Reading and Writing – Year 2



- To use sentences of different forms such as statements, commands, questions and exclamations. Exclamation sentences start with what or how e.g. What a beautiful day we had!
- To continue to ensure that all these sentences are correctly punctuated with capital letters (including proper nouns), full stops, exclamation marks and question marks.
- To add suffixes to words e.g. ment, ness, full, less, ly.
- To spell some words in contracted forms e.g. I will to I'll. I can not to can't.



- Read aloud their home/school reading book regularly. (5 times a week). Re-reading books to build up their fluency and confidence in word reading.
- To make simple inferences about characters thoughts and feelings and reasons for actions on the basis of what is being said or done.
- To continue to discuss favourite words and phrases and begin to understand the effect of different words e.g. to create humour, images and atmosphere.

Summer targets for maths - Year 2

Fractions

To identify $\frac{1}{3}$, $\frac{1}{4}$, $\frac{1}{2}$, $\frac{2}{4}$, and $\frac{3}{4}$, of objects and numbers.

The children know that all parts must be equal parts of the whole, whether this is of a shape or number. They can recognise that a $\frac{1}{2}$ is equal to $\frac{2}{4}$.

To find fractions of numbers they share this between the parts e.g. $\frac{1}{4}$ of 12. Share 12 into four groups. $\frac{1}{4} = 3$, $\frac{3}{4} = 9$.

To continue to recall and use the multiplication and division facts for the 2, 5 and 10 times tables. Extend to the 3 times tables.

The children need to be able to recall these facts in and out of order. They can use their multiplication facts to help with division e.g. If I know $2 \times 5 = 10$ then I know $10 \div 5 = 2$ and can use the inverse facts.

Please continue to practise the previous targets. These included:

- To mentally add and subtract a two digit number and ones.
- Know **all** addition and subtraction facts for each number to 20.

Regular practise will help to embed facts and develop a greater mental fluency.
